

**Reference:** (حوالہ)

This stanza has been taken from the poem "Daffodils" written by "William Wordsworth".

**Context:** (مقن)

The beautiful scenes of nature have a great attraction for the poet. Once he was walking in a country side. He reached along the bank of a lake. He saw a large number of golden daffodils growing there. He was very happy to see the sight of beautiful daffodils. The scene left a permanent impression on the mind of the poet.

**Paraphrase:** آسان لفظوں میں مفہوم

In this stanza, the poet describes that the waves of the stream were dancing beside the daffodils, but the daffodils looked happier than the waves. A poet could not help feeling happy in the company of such merrymakers. He went on looking at those daffodils and did not think what wealth of joy and peace that scene had brought to him.

Ans. The spider succeeded after making nine attempts.
